

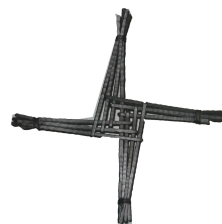
- There is a book in the Chantry/Remembrance Chapel for prayer requests.
- The Very Reverend Dr Gregor Duncan has been elected our next Bishop. We remember him in our prayers at this most important and exciting moment in his ministry and in the life of our Diocese.
- Choral Evensong and Benediction will take place at 3.30 this afternoon. The Canticles will be sung to the setting by Sumsion in A, and the anthem will be *Like as the hart* by Herbert Howells.
- Our Patronal Festival will take place on Sunday 31 January. There will be a Festival Eucharist and Procession at 10.30 a.m. at which the Preacher will be the Right Reverend John Davies, former Bishop of St Asaph. The service will be followed by a St Bride's Day Lunch. Tickets priced £12.50 are available in Church.
- The menu for St Bride's Day is soup (suitable also for vegetarians), choice of steak pie or butterflied chicken, and trifle. A vegetarian option will be provided for those who request this in advance. It is imperative that you do this, as these meals will be delivered with the recipient's name on them. Please make sure to tick your choice of main course when you buy your ticket. Members of the congregation are invited to donate bottles of wine which we can enjoy with our lunch.
- On this day we will also be inviting members of the congregation to make a special donation to the Church, which will, we hope, help to resolve our financial difficulties.
- The large bottle is at the back of the church for donations for flowers for St Bride's Day. If people would put their donations in a Gift Aid envelope, we can reclaim tax. Eileen Maitland hopes to have the new flower rota up shortly for people to note when they would like to put flowers in church.
