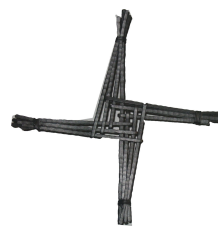


- Papers for the Annual Congregational Meeting on Sunday 13 September are available for collection today at the back of Church, and have been sent by e-mail to those members of the congregation for whom the Secretary has addresses. Nomination forms for the following positions are now available at the back of Church:
Lay Representative: Miss Mary Sillitto is eligible for re-election.
Alternative Lay Representative. Miss Anne Blackwood is eligible for re-election.
People's Warden: Mr Richard Smith is eligible for re-election.
Two Voting Members of the Vestry in succession to Mr John Marks, who retires by rotation and is not eligible for re-election; and Mrs Alison Gifford, who has retired owing to her appointment as Rector's Warden (which confers membership of the Vestry *ex officio*).
 Nominations for the positions of Lay Representative, Alternative Lay Representative, People's Warden and Voting Member of the Vestry must be in the hands of the Secretary to the Vestry one week before the Annual Congregational Meeting (i.e. today).
 Nominations may be left in the folder at the back of Church.
 Nominations must be signed by a proposer and a seconder and must be accompanied by a statement from the candidate that he or she is willing to stand for election.
 There is also a vacancy for a **North-West Regional Council Representative**. Nominations for this position may be made prior to the meeting or from the floor. Mr Roy Parkin is eligible for re-election.
